ENTRY FEES

\$25.00 per dog per test.

Entries close online **Sunday, October 20, 2024, 6PM CT**, unless the numerical limit is reached prior to the date after which time entries will not be accepted, canceled, altered, or substituted.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE.

Open to all dogs at least 6 months of age by the day of the trial that are individually registered with the American Kennel Club, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, and dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. A dog may enter only once per test.

Condition of the Dog: Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the Fetch test. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs are allowed to enter so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the test, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

There are two tests on the day of the event. Each test has an individual event number. <u>If you would like your dog to participate in both tests</u>, <u>you must enter and pay for both tests</u>.

Phone, fax, mail or email entries will NOT be accepted.

Day-of-Show entries will not be accepted at this event.

RIBBONS and ROSETTES

- A Dark Green Flat Ribbon will be awarded to each dog achieving a qualifying score.
- Special Rosettes will be awarded to each dog completing a title.
- Be sure to notify the Event Secretary of any titles anticipated to be earned during this event.

Any titles attained for which Rosettes are not available on the day they are attained will be mailed to the recipient as soon as they become available.

ROUTE TO SHOW

From the North – Take I-24 East crossing the Ohio River into Kentucky. Get off the Interstate at Exit 7 (Mayfield/Bardwell). At the top of the ramp, turn right onto Highway 62. Continue on Highway 62 going west approximately 7.5 miles until you reach Highway 305 on your right. Turn right and go 1/8 mile to the kennel club entrance on your left.

From the South – Take I-24 West to Paducah. Get off the interstate at Exit 7 (Mayfield/Bardwell). At the bottom of the ramp, go straight ahead on the access road parallel to the Interstate. At Highway 62, turn left and go over the Interstate. Continue on Highway 62 going west approximately 7.5 miles until you reach Highway 305 on your right. Turn right and go 1/8 mile to the kennel club entrance on your left.

From the West – Take US Highway 60/62 from Cairo, Illinois. In Wickliffe, turn right and follow Highway 62. Go approximately 20 miles until you see Highway 305 turn off to your LEFT. Turn left and go 1/8 mile to the kennel club entrance on your left.

PARKING INFORMATION: Please park in the designated parking area only.

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS: All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after themselves AND their dogs at their motel, RV grounds and test site. Motels and campgrounds require that dogs not be left unattended. Any damage to motels, RV grounds or the test grounds or test equipment may result in disciplinary action by the Event Committee. Please clean up after your dogs immediately while on the event grounds. *Keep a bag in your pocket at all times.

SCHEDULE

- 1. A brief handlers' meeting will be held prior to each run block.
- 2. All dogs will be inspected beginning at 8:30AM for soundness prior to participating.
- 3. ALL dogs must be checked-in prior to 11:30AM for morning runs and 2:30PM for afternoon runs.
- 4. These events will be run with an established run order to the best ability of the Secretary.

Adjustments due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances may be necessary.

- 5. Run start times are 9:00AM.
- *-All times stated are Central Time Zone (CT)

Field Hours: 8:30AM until all runs are completed or 3PM, whichever comes first. In the event of inclement weather or other conditions, or to assist with timely completion of the trial, the Trial

Committee may elect to start or end the events earlier, or later than posted. In any case, all entrants present during the posted times will be allowed to run, if conditions are safe.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete.

Condition of the Dog. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the Fetch test. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs are allowed to enter so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the test, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

IMPORTANT – PLEASE READ!

Runs blocks will be scheduled when you register for the event. You will be able to choose your run block, based upon availability, when you register. (Register early to ensure the best selection of run blocks.)

Any dog not present by the time the trial ends will be considered absent.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

REFUNDS AND FEES: No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury, must give a vet letter stating the injury to check in table prior to the start of the trial.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. **All refunds are less standard PayPal processing fees**.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY: The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly**

understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Forest City Dog Training Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Forest City Dog Training Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Forest City Dog Training Club or any official thereof. COLLARS, LEASHES AND HARNESSES. Dogs must wear a collar. Dogs may wear slip collars, buckle collars, and Martingales in the AKC Fetch trial. They may not wear prong collars, e-collars, head collars, muzzles, or body harnesses. Leashes should be 4 ft. to 6 ft. long and should be made of fabric, leather, or biothane. NO Extendable / Retractable leashes are allowed on-site.

The club reserves the right to remove any dog in distress in a parked vehicle or crate.

Please keep the grounds clean by picking up after yourself and your dog. Dispose of 'poop' bags in the trash containers provided there. Please keep your crating area, the trial site, grounds, motel rooms, campsites and all grounds clean so we may continue to be welcomed at these facilities.

The Club assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, their dogs, property, children or guests. Neither the trial committees nor the trial-giving club nor any volunteers nor any vendors or their assignees will be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog, person, or property, on the trial grounds, whether as a result of an accident or any other cause. It is clearly understood that every dog entered in the trial is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the trial premises.

Exhibitors, Owners & Agents assume all responsibility for dogs & equipment on the show site.

Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form. Breed should be marked as "All American Dog."

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email.

Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH test they are entered.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations."

Additionally, clubs should include any specific local or state health requirements; for example, proof of rabies vaccination.

ERRORS ON ENTRIES: Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry form. Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Event Secretary prior to the closing date of the trial. Other means of notification will not be accepted. Errors on entries may lead to errors in results being submitted to AKC. It is the responsibility of the entrant to review the results and notify the Event Secretary via email (posting on social media will NOT lead to corrections being processed).

CONDUCT: It is expressly understood that all owners/agents/exhibitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any person(s) whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the test site. In such cases no refund of any fees/monies paid will be made.

ALL owners/agents/exhibitors and other persons attending these tests hereby waive any claim against the club or its agents, for any losses, damages, or injuries affecting self, dogs, children, or personal property.

WARM-UPS and training should be conducted in a sportsman-like manner to your dog, other dogs and competitors, away from the running course, so as not to create any sort of distraction for dogs running, or waiting to run.

VACCINATIONS: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

CRATING: Crating will be in your own vehicles, or inside the open arena located in the barn.

GENERAL

- All entrants must be 6 months of age or older on the day of the trial.
- The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.
- There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose dog not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
- No one except the appointed field committee will be allowed on the field other than during their assigned test, without the express permission of the field chairman.
- Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
- Control of dogs is strictly enforced. All dogs must be kept on leash at all times, except when participating in their assigned test. Dogs must be leashed until after fully entering and prior to leaving the course and secured during the entire time while the dog is off leash.
- All participants and attendees will clean up and carry out all of their trash.
