# **ENTRY FEES**

A WAITLIST OF TEN RUNS PER TEST MAY BE MAINTAINED FOR DROPS.

Open to all dogs at least 1 year of age by the day of the test that are individually registered with the American Kennel Club, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. A dog may enter only once per event. There are two events each day. Each event has an individual event number.

If you would like your dog to run twice each day, you must enter and pay for both events for each day. This can easily be accomplished during a single sign-in/registration on the website by selecting each event you wish to enter.

Phone, fax, mail or email entries will NOT be accepted.

Day-of-Show entries **MAY** be accepted (\$35) at the discretion of the Committee **IF** spots are available.

# **RIBBONS and ROSETTES**

- A Light Blue Flat Ribbon will be awarded to each dog achieving a qualifying run.
- Special Rosettes will be awarded to each dog completing a title.
- Be sure to notify the Event Secretary of any titles above FCAT anticipated during this event. (We generally have enough title rosettes on hand for BCAT, DCAT and FCAT titles.) This can easily be accomplished during a single sign-in/registration on the website by selecting the expected title you anticipate achieving during these events for each dog.

Any titles attained for which Rosettes are not available on the day they are attained will be mailed to the recipient as soon as they become available.

**NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:** All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after themselves AND their dogs at their motel, RV grounds and Show Site. Motels and campgrounds require that dogs not be left unattended. Any damage to motels, RV grounds or the test grounds or test equipment may result in disciplinary action by the Event Committee. Please clean up after your dogs immediately while on the event grounds. \*Keep a bag in your pocket at all times.

#### **SCHEDULE**

- 1. A brief handlers' meeting will be held prior to each run block.
- 2. All dogs will be inspected for soundness prior to running on each event date beginning at 7:30am for 8:00am-10:00am runs, 9:30 am for 10:00am-12:00pm runs and 12:30pm for 1:00pm-3:00pm runs.
- 3. ALL dogs must be checked in prior to 9:30am for 8:00am-10:00am runs, 11:30am for 10:00am-12:00pm runs and 1:30pm for 1:00pm-3:00pm runs.
- 4. These events will be run with an established run order to the best ability of the Paddock Master. Adjustments due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances may be necessary.
- 5. Run block start times are 8:00am, 10:00am and 1:00pm.

# \*-All times stated are Central Time Zone (CT)

**Field Hours**: 7:30am until all runs are completed or 3:30pm, whichever comes first. In the event of inclement weather or other conditions or to assist with timely completion of the test, the Test Committee may elect to start or end the events earlier or later than posted. In any case, all entrants present during the posted times will be allowed to run, if conditions are safe

**Lunch**: A 60-minute lunch break <u>MAY</u> be scheduled at the discretion of the Event Committee.

## Scheduling of Runs / Concurrent Run Procedures / Note to Handlers

Both events are being run concurrently. This means we schedule dogs to run both runs for each day within a single run block. In this scenario, if you have one dog entered and you are scheduled in the 8:00am-10:00am run block to do both runs, your two runs will be scheduled approximately 30 runs apart, giving your dog time to rest. The 10:00am-12:00pm and 1:00pm-3:00pm portion will be run the same way.

Run blocks will be scheduled when you register for the event. You will be able to choose your run block, based upon availability, when you register. (Register early to ensure the best selection of run blocks.)

Any dog not present by the time the test ends will be considered absent.



# **ATTENTION EXHIBITORS**

**REFUNDS AND FEES:** Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Event Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the test- giving club it is impossible to open or to complete the test, refund of entry fees may or may not be made, at the Event Committee's discretion.

Refunds for bitches in season (and lame or unfit dogs) <u>will be refunded</u>, if requests are submitted to the Test Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of judging for the day. **All refunds are less a 5% processing fees**.

**Mixed breed dogs** that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form. Breed should be marked as "All American Dog."

ERRORS ON ENTRIES: Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry form. Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Event Secretary prior to the closing date of the test. Other means of notification will not be accepted. Errors on entries may lead to errors in results being submitted to AKC. It is the responsibility of the entrant to review the results and notify the Event Secretary via email (posting or messaging on social media will NOT lead to corrections being processed).

**CRATING:** Crating will be in your own vehicles.

**WARM-UPS** and training should be conducted in a sportsman-like manner to your dog, other dogs and competitors, away from the running course, so as not to create any sort of distraction for dogs running or waiting to run.

All dogs MUST be on a short leash of 6 ft in length or less or confined to a crate and under control while on the test grounds, except during their runs. **Retractable leads ARE <u>NOT</u> allowed onsite**. Dogs must be on a leash when being exercised, trained, or when warming up. Dogs must be removed from the test course immediately following the end of the Test. Exercise your dogs only in posted areas and clean up after them!

No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside of any building or within 100 feet of any tent or the running course. No excessively loud generators are allowed anywhere on event grounds.

#### **PURINA FARMS & EVENT CENTER RULES**

- **RVs** may begin using their reserved spots at Purina Event Center upper lot on their first reserved day but not before **3pm**, Sunday, June 15.
- No dogs in Checkerboard Café.
- No private exercise pens in the building.
- All crates must be on a solid matting that won't allow liquids or other substances to seep through to the floor.
- No grooming in the building outside of designated grooming areas.
- No soft side crates in the Great Hall except in Obedience/Rally/Agility Area.
- No grooming at ringside. No grooming tables at ringside. This will be strictly enforced.
- Exhibitors and handlers will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their crates and parking spaces.
- Anyone causing undue disturbance will be asked to leave the show grounds.
- DO NOT LEAVE DOGS IN CLOSED VEHICLES.
- Aisles must be kept open in the Grooming and Showing areas.
- Overnight Security will NOT be provided in the building.
- NO DOGS MAY REMAIN INSIDE THE BUILDING OVERNIGHT.

- No wagons, buggies, golf carts, skates, bicycles or scooters will be allowed inside the buildings.
- EXHIBITORS & GUESTS: No one is permitted anywhere that is marked "Employees Only" and/or "No Admittance." Violators will be reported to the AKC.
- No Smoking (including electronic cigarettes) in the buildings.
- No push pins, nails or any type of things going into the walls. No adhesive should be used to affix a sign to a wall.
- No dogs are permitted on the second floor of the Event Center except for a scheduled class or when specifically invited for an
  event
- No outside food or beverage is allowed on the Purina Farms property. Violators will be reported to the AKC.

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

In the event a severe weather or tornado warning is issued for the immediate area, Site Security will notify the Purina Farms management team. The team will notify guests of an impending weather event via the property-wide public address system. Public service announcements should also come via the storm siren and announcements. Guests will be asked to seek cover in designated areas marked as severe weather shelter areas inside the Purina Farms facilities (those in the outdoor event areas should seek cover in one of the indoor facilities on the property). Areas at the Purina Event Center include the Gateway Hall, restrooms, South stairwell and the Great Hall if necessary. At the Visitor Center, this includes the bathrooms, indoor theater and the hallway near the front information desk. After the weather event ends, Purina Farms management teams will announce all clear.

If weather is extreme after-hours, then security will unlock the Purina Event Center to allow overnight guests to come into the building with dogs at any time. The service center is also open 24/7 for campers to seek shelter. Should the weather look threatening, Purina Farms Security will go around the lots to notify overnight guests to seek shelter.

#### **NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS - ALL EVENTS**

The American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations will govern this show and exhibitors must make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, as printed at the end of this Premium List.

# **CLUB RULES:**

#### **ATTENTION ALL EVENT EXHIBITORS**

- All dogs must be kept on leash except when being judged in off-leash events such as Agility, Barn Hunt, Dock Diving, Fast CAT, Obedience, Rally, Road Trial, and/or Scent Work.
- At no time can dogs be tied out or otherwise left attached to anything other than a human when outside a crate, car, or other secure enclosed confinement. Leashes cannot be left dangling or dragging. Standing or stepping on a leash is not allowed as a form of restraint (but may be used in an emergency to help secure a loose dog.) Accommodations to this rule may be made for differently-abled handlers as determined by the Club.
- The show site will be made available to exhibitors, SUNDAY, JUNE 15, 2025. **The Great Hall is NOT AVAILABLE to EXHIBITORS BEFORE 4PM.**
- No unentered dogs or puppies allowed in building per AKC guidelines.
- No working (practice) in rings before or after show hours. Dogs are allowed in rings only during judging hours and scheduled practice times.
- No crates at conformation ringside.
- Crates in the performance area of the Great Hall MUST BE REMOVED BY THE END OF THOSE EVENTS ON WEDNESDAY.
- No washing of animal food containers in restrooms.

- Bathing of dogs limited to bathing area in the Service Center. **NOTE: The Service Center Building restrooms, showers and** dog wash room will be off limits from 10AM-3PM on Monday and Tuesday to accommodate Scent Work Trial Classes. Please plan accordingly.
- Pick up after your dogs and dispose in provided receptacles.
- No videotaping or photography during the events for resale is permitted without the Dalmatian Club of America, Inc. approval.
- **Please be advised:** when an exhibitor/handler brings a dog to the podium for a win/placement photo they are establishing a de facto contract with the show photographer to purchase that photo.
- No baby strollers are allowed in the show site or adjacent hallways during show hours.
- Unless otherwise specified, all trophies and awards must be claimed the day of the show. **None will be mailed.** The club reserves the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.
- **VACCINATIONS:** Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- Waiver of Rights Any dog found in an unsafe environment, distress or harm's way (for example left unattended on a grooming table in a noose not attached to a safety release clip; left in a vehicle without proper ventilation) will be removed. Exposing a dog to an unsafe environment, distress or harm's way is considered mistreatment. All persons attending this show hereby waive any claim for damages against the host clubs and Nestle-Purina in the event a motor vehicle must be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or improperly vented conditions.
- The club is not responsible for the products or actions of Vendors at this show.
- PLEASE NOTE: It is expressly understood that exhibitors or spectators alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor or spectator whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior or whose equipment creates an impediment to the safe flow of traffic may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the event site. In such cases, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- LIABILITY. The show-giving clubs, their members, Nestle-Purina, show superintendent, trial secretaries, their agents, employees, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or any of their dogs or property and further assume no responsibility for injury to children & further expect exhibitors and spectators to keep their children and dogs under strict control.
- The hotel(s) allowing exhibitors and their dogs to stay with them while attending these shows have been advised to report any misuse of their establishment(s) by exhibitors entered in these shows to the 2025 Specialty Event Committees. Please be advised that if an exhibitor is reported and is found to be in violation of the hotel(s) rules, such a report could result in an Event Committee Hearing.
- All AKC Rules and Regulations will be enforced by the Show Event Committee under AKC guidelines. Failure to comply with
  these rules and/or rules within this Premium List will result in charges being brought before the Show Event Committee.

# **FAST CAT RULES & NOTICES**

- All entered dogs must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
- Each entry will be examined at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded less a 5% processing fee. All dogs will be inspected before each event.
- The Run Order will be based on run blocks set by the Event Secretary in conjunction with the field committee. We will separate the running of multiple dogs handled by a single handler to the best of our abilities. If a dog is late for their run time they will run as soon as openings are available to avoid

inconveniencing those that arrived as scheduled.

- Dogs may run without a collar or may wear any type of collar except choker collars, electronic training collars or head collars. You MAY bring your dogs to the line in a choke or head halter, but they MUST be removed in order to run. Collars should be snug. "Pinch Collars", or collars with prongs are not allowed anywhere onsite. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up on something during the run. Owners should be aware that there is a chance that tags hanging from the collar could become entangled on something during the run. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's tags or hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regards to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.
- The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.
- There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose dog not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
- No one except the appointed field committee will be allowed on the field other than during their assigned run, without the express permission of the field chairman.
- Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
- Control of dogs is strictly enforced. All dogs must be kept on leash at all times, except when running inside the fenced course. Dogs must be leashed until after fully entering and prior to leaving the running course with the gates remaining closed and secured during the entire time while the dog is off leash.
- All participants and attendees will clean up and carry out all of their trash.

#### SPECIAL PERFORMANCE AWARD - THE TRIATHLETE CHALLENGE

If you and your dog are a multi-tasking team, set your sights on the Specialty Triathlete Challenge, a special award given to EACH Dalmatian/handler team that earns a qualifying leg or passing score in three (3) or more performance/companion venues during the National Specialty. The eligible events are Tracking, Road Trial - CC/CCC, CCI/CCIC, RD/RDC, RDX classes; Agility—all titling classes; Obedience - all titling classes; Rally - all titling classes; Barn Hunt - all titling classes; Scent Work – all titling classes, Fast CAT, and Dock Diving. Only one score or performance in each venue will count towards this award, and the performance must be at the titling level, although the dog/handler team may already have earned the relevant title. If your dog can hock, heel, sniff, run, or jump, just pick your venues and go for the challenge!

Triathlete Forms <u>must</u> be turned in before 7 pm on June 19. All awards must be picked up at the Performance Breakfast. NO AWARDS WILL BE MAILED.

#### **Basic Information about AKC Fast Cat**

- Fast CAT Test is a timed straight 100 yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be a fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner.
- Dogs run singularly.

#### **How are Fast CAT Points and Titles Awarded?**

- The dog's time to complete the 100 yard dash is converted into MPH.
- A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned.
  - The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers.
    - o 18 inches or greater = handicap of 1.0
    - o 12 inches to less than 18 inches = handicap of 1.5
    - o Below 12 inches = handicap of 2.0
- Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap
- Fast CAT titles are suffix titles earned at designated milestones.
  - BCAT=150 points
  - DCAT=500 points
  - FCAT = 1,000 points
  - FCAT = every additional 500 points

# CONDUCT OF THE EVENT

**Check in and Inspection:** Dogs must be checked in and inspected prior to each run. Inspection will check for general fitness, intact All American dogs and for females in season, neither of which are permitted to run. In addition, the dog's handicap must be verified at the time of inspection. Dogs may be measured via use of a wicket to confirm height if there is any question regarding the dog's true height. You will receive a sticker at inspection that is to be turned in to the Paddock Master.

Paddock Master: The Paddock Master will coordinate the running of the dogs according to their best discretion. Each pre-entered exhibitor will receive running order information via e-mail during the week prior to the event. Dogs will be called to "in the hole" positions. Dogs that are not present "in the hole" will be moved down and the next available dog will be inserted into the running order to keep things moving. The missing dog will be inserted into the running order as convenient when they arrive. If you miss your assigned run time, you will not be required to wait until all the dogs have run. You can run, within reason, sometime after you arrive and when you can be inserted into the run order without delaying those that were available on time.

**Timer/Ribbon Tables:** The Timer/Ribbon Tentwill be positioned outside the exit gate and near the finish line. The Timer Person will monitor the runs and timer activation to watch for and react to errors involving improper timer triggers such as bag times or any flying debris such as bugs, or leaves, etc. Ribbons should be available to pick-up by the time you exit the course and walk to the Timer/Ribbon Tent. Please be patient if they are delayed and minimize any communication or talk in the area so they can focus on the job at hand. This job requires focus.

**Safety**: Safety is of the utmost importance. It is the responsibility of the event committee to ensure the safety of the course, equipment and conduct of those involved with the event. It is recommended that the event committee run a test dog prior to the start of the event to ensure that the equipment functions properly, and all personnel understand their jobs. Prior to moving the lure to position it for the start, the lure operator shall announce "hold your dogs" in order to caution owners.

**Huntmaster:** By AKC rule, The Huntmaster has control of the course. The Huntmaster is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. They shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, the lure is properly positioned, the lure operator, timers and starting line signal person are ready and shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and then give the verbal signal "Tally Ho" for the handler to release the dog. **DO NOT** release your dog before or hold your dog after the "Tally Ho" is given!

The Start: The club must provide a 10 foot start box that is clearly marked. The dogs toes must be on or over the back line and not close enough to the start line to set off the timer prematurely. It is recommended an owner or someone familiar with the dog be at the start to release the dog. The Club <u>will attempt</u> to provide assistance at the beginning of the course to release dogs considered to be "safe" <u>as a courtesy</u>, if the owner requests it <u>and if volunteers are available and willing to release a particular dog.</u> Please exit the course as soon as your dog is secured and leashed at the other end.

**Field Conditions:** The ideal field is reasonably flat, level and mowed. The ideal running area is approximately 153 yards long x 6 yards wide, with a plastic mesh type barrier fencing and flexible support posts. The course is measured to be exactly 100 yards long with start and finish line timers (electronic or manual) and an appropriate AKC prescribed runout area. Handlers may not walk the course during or before their dog is released for the actual test.

**The Finish**: The club must provide enough room for a safe run-out area. The Club will attempt to use a minimum of 50 yards, if onsite conditions at the time of the tests safely allow it. It is recommended an owner or someone familiar with the dog be at the finish to catch the dog once the course is completed. The Club will attempt to provide assistance at the end of the course to collect dogs considered to be "safe" as a courtesy, if the owner requests it and if volunteers are available and willing to release a particular dog. Please exit the course as soon as your dog is secured and leashed.

# **COURSE AND EQUIPMENT**

**Timing Devices**: The Club will use electronic timers. The time to complete the course is recorded to the nearest 1/100<sup>th</sup> of a second. The time starts when any part of the dog crosses the finish line. Stop watches will be used as a backup if the electronic timers don't function. In the event of manual timing, a starter's flag will signal the start when the dog's nose crosses the starting line and the time will be recorded by two time keepers positioned near the finish line, each operating individually. The time will be the mathematical average of the two manually recorded times.

**Lure Equipment:** The Club proudly uses Swift Paws Pro Alpha equipment on a continuous loop system. The lure will consist of white plastic bags and/or squawker. The lure will be propelled by an electric motor attached to a continuous loop setup. Safety is the number one consideration in running this event and all equipment has been selected for this primary purpose.

**Operation of the Lure:** The Lure Operator's job is to 1) ensure a safe run by operating the lure correctly, and 2) to get the best score for your dog. If your dog is new to the sport, tell the Huntmaster so they can notify the LO. That may mean operating the lure differently, to get the dog's attention, as opposed to an experienced dog that needs little to no encouragement. If your dog is particularly fast for its breed, simply advise the Huntmaster about your dog's typical time or speed. They will tell the LO via radio, who may adjust the running of the lure to accommodate this. Simply saying "fast dog" has no relative meaning as a fast Beagle runs very differently from a fast Whippet. Actual times or speed are much more helpful.

# AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
