ENTRY FEES

Pre-Entry is \$25.00 per dog per test (includes \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee per run).

Entries close online **Wednesday, May 1, 2024, 7PM ET**, unless the numerical limit is reached prior to the date after which time entries will not be accepted, canceled, altered, or substituted.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE.
A WAITLIST OF TEN RUNS PER TEST MAY BE MAINTAINED FOR DROPS.

Open to all dogs at least 1 year of age by the day of the test that are individually registered with the American Kennel Club, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, and dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. A dog may enter only once per event. There are two events each day. Each event has an individual event number. If you would like your dog to run twice each day, you must enter and pay for both events each day.

Phone, fax, mail or email entries will NOT be accepted.

Day-of-Show entries <u>MAY</u> be accepted (\$30) at the discretion of the Committe <u>IF</u> spots are available.

RIBBONS and ROSETTES

- A Light Blue Flat Ribbon will be awarded to each dog achieving a qualifying run.
- Special Rosettes will be awarded to each dog completing a title.
- Be sure to notify the Event Secretary of any titles above FCAT anticipated to be earned during this event. (We generally have enough title ribbons onhand for BCAT, DCAT and FCAT titles...)

Any titles attained for which Rosettes are not available on the day they are attained will be mailed to the recipient as soon as they become available.

ROUTE TO SHOW

FROM NORTH: Follow I-67S to IN-39S in Martinsville, turn left. Follow IN-39S to I-695 / IN375 to Bloomington. Take Exit 117 toward Bloomfield Rad. Turn right onto West Airport Rd for .6 miles. Fairground is on your, (Gate 3).

FROM SOUTH: Follow I65N to Columbus, IN. Take exit 68 to IN-46E to 3rd St. Follow to IN-46W to Exit 117 toward Bloomfield Rd. Turn right on West Airport Rd for .6 miles. Fairground is on right, (Gate 3).

FROM EAST: I-74W to Exit 134A (IN-3) toward Greensburg, IN. Stay straight to go onto IN-46W toward Bloomington. Merge onto I-695S / IN-45S / IN-37S. Take exit 117 to Bloomfield Rd. Turn right onto West Airport Rd for .6 miles. Fairground is on right, (Gate 3).

FROM WEST: Follow I-70W / US-40E. Take exit 23 for IN-59 toward Brazil. Turn left onto SR-46E and follow for 48 miles. Take ramp to merge onto I-69/IN37S. Take Exit 117 to Bloomfield Rd. Turn right onto West Airport Rd for .6 miles. Fairground is on right, (Gate 3).

Do not leave unattended dogs in your room and PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOGS!

PARKING INFORMATION: There is a \$5 (<u>CASH ONLY</u>) daily parking fee for exhibitor parking. Please park <u>only</u> in the designated parking areas and do not take up more than one space per vehicle. If adjacent spaces are full or unavailable, there are more spaces available nearby.

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS: All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after themselves AND their dogs at their motel, RV grounds and test site. Motels and campgrounds require that dogs not be left unattended. Any damage to motels, RV grounds or the test grounds or test equipment may result in disciplinary action by the Event Committee. Please clean up after your dogs immediately while on the event grounds. *Keep a bag in your pocket at all times.

SCHEDULE

- 1. A brief handlers' meeting will be held prior to each run block.
- 2. All dogs will be inspected beginning at 7:30am for AM runs (12:30pm for PM runs) for soundness prior to running on that event date.
- 3. ALL dogs must be checked-in prior to 11:30am for morning runs and prior to 2:30pm for afternoon runs.
- 4. These events will be run with an established run order to the best ability of the Paddock Master. Adjustments due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances may be necessary.
- 5. AM and PM run start times are 8:00am and 1:00pm.
- *-All times stated are Eastern Time Zone (ET)

Field Hours: 7:30am until all runs are completed or 3:00pm, whichever comes first. In the event of inclement weather or other conditions, or to assist with timely completion of the test, the Test Committee may elect to start or end the events earlier, or later than posted. In any case, all entrants present during the posted times will be allowed to run, if conditions are safe.

Lunch: A 60-minute lunch break will be scheduled at the discretion of the Event Committee.

Scheduling of Runs / Concurrent Run Procedures / Note to Handlers

Both events are being run concurrently. This means we schedule dogs to run both runs for each day within a single run block. In this scenario, if you have one dog entered and you are scheduled in the AM to do both runs, your two runs will be scheduled approximately 30 runs apart, giving your dog time to rest. The PM portion will be run the same way as the AM.

Runs blocks will be scheduled when you register for the event. You will be able to choose your run block, based upon availability, when you register. (Register early to ensure the best selection of run blocks.)

Any dog not present by the time the test ends will be considered absent.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

REFUNDS AND FEES: Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Test Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the test-giving club it is impossible to open or to complete the test, refund of entry fees may or may not be made, at the Event Committee's discretion.

Refunds for bitches in season (and lame or unfit dogs) will be refunded, if requests are submitted to the Field Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of judging for the day and are accompanied by a veterinarian certification. All refunds are less standard PayPal processing fees.

CLUB RULES: All dogs MUST be on a short leash of 6 ft in length or less or confined to a crate and under control while on the test grounds, except during their runs. **Retractable leads ARE NOT allowed onsite.** Dogs must be on a leash when being exercised, trained, or when warming up. Dogs must be removed from the test course immediately following the end of the Test. Exercise your dogs only in posted areas and clean up after them! Exhibitors must exercise control over their children at all times while on the test grounds. No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside of any building or within 100 feet of any tent or the running course. No excessively loud generators are allowed anywhere on event grounds.

The club reserves the right to remove any dog in distress in a parked vehicle or crate.

Please keep the grounds clean by picking up after yourself and your dog. Dispose of 'poop' bags in the trash containers provided there. Please keep your crating area, the test site, grounds, motel rooms, campsites and all grounds clean so we may continue to be welcomed at these facilities.

The Club assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, their dogs, property, children or guests. Neither the test committees nor the test-giving club nor any volunteers nor any vendors or their assignees will be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog, person, or property, on the test grounds, whether as a result of an accident or any other cause. It is clearly understood that every dog entered in the test is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the test premises.

<u>Exhibitors</u>, <u>Owners & Agents assume all responsibility for dogs & equipment on the show</u> site.

Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form. Breed should be marked as "All American Dog."

ERRORS ON ENTRIES: Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry form. Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Event Secretary prior to the closing date of the test. Other means of notification will not be accepted. Errors on entries may lead to errors in results being submitted to AKC. It is the responsibility of the entrant to review the results and notify the Event Secretary via email (posting on social media will NOT lead to corrections being processed).

CONDUCT: It is expressly understood that all owners/agents/exhibitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any person(s) whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Test Committee, be asked to leave the test site. In such cases no refund of any fees/monies paid will be made.

RELEASORS/CATCHERS: Each handler is responsible for arranging to have both a releaser **AND** a catcher available during each of their dogs' runs. The Club **may** provide volunteers to assist with releasing or catching well-mannered dogs but is not obligated to do so for every dog. When this assistance is available, it is strictly a courtesy and the volunteers accept no responsibility for any actions or consequences.

All owners/agents/exhibitors and other persons attending these tests hereby waive any claim against the club or its agents, for any losses, damages, or injuries affecting self, dogs, children, or personal property.

WARM-UPS and training should be conducted in a sportsman-like manner to your dog, other dogs and competitors, away from the running course, so as not to create any sort of distraction for dogs running, or waiting to run.

VACCINATIONS: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

CRATING: Crating will be in your own vehicles.

GENERAL

- All entrants must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
- Each entry will be examined at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of
 wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found
 to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees
 shall be refunded. All dogs will be inspected before each event.
- The Run Order will be based on run blocks set by the Event Secretary in conjunction with the Field Committee. We will separate the running of multiple dogs handled by a single handler to the best of our abilities. If a dog is late for their run time they will run as soon as openings are available to avoid inconveniencing those that arrived as scheduled.
- Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a harness, a collar with prongs, or an
 electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up
 on something during the run. Owners should be aware that there is a chance that tags hanging
 from the collar could become entangled on something during the run. Owners may use clips or
 rubber bands to hold the dog's tags or hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of
 the dog with regards to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.
- The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.
- There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose dog not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
- No one except the appointed field committee will be allowed on the field other than during their assigned run, without the express permission of the field chairman.
- Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
- Control of dogs is strictly enforced. All dogs must be kept on leash at all times, except when
 running inside the fenced course. Dogs must be leashed until after fully entering and prior to
 leaving the running course with the gates remaining closed and secured during the entire time
 while the dog is off leash.
- All participants and attendees will clean up and carry out all of their trash.

Basic Information about AKC Fast Cat

- Fast CAT Test is a timed straight 100 yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be a fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner.
- Dogs run singularly.

How are Fast CAT Points and Titles Awarded?

- The dog's time to complete the 100 yard dash is converted into MPH.
- A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned.
 The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers.
 - 18 inches or greater = handicap of 1.0
 - o 12 inches to less than 18 inches = handicap of 1.5
 - o Below 12 inches = handicap of 2.0
- Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap
- Fast CAT titles are suffix titles earned at designated milestones.

- BCAT = 150 points
- DCAT = 500 points
- FCAT = 1,000 points
- FCAT = every additional 500 points
- The top 20 fastest dogs by breeds are published on the AKC website. AKC Top 20 List

CONDUCT OF THE EVENT

Check in and Inspection: Dogs must be checked in and inspected prior to each run. Inspection will check for general fitness, intact All American dogs and for females in season, neither of which are permitted to run. In addition, the dog's handicap must be verified at the time of inspection. Dogs may be measured via use of a wicket to confirm height if there is any question regarding the dog's true height. You will receive a sticker at inspection that is to be turned in to the Paddock Master.

Paddock Master: The Paddock Master will coordinate the running of the dogs according to their best discretion. Each pre-entered exhibitor will receive running order information via e-mail during the week prior to the event. Dogs will be called to "in the hole" positions. Dogs that are not present "in the hole" will be moved down and the next available dog will be inserted into the running order to keep things moving. The missing dog will be inserted into the running order as convenient when they arrive. If you miss your assigned run time, you will not be required to wait until all the dogs have run. You can run, within reason, sometime after you arrive and when you can be inserted into the run order without delaying those that were available ontime.

Timer / Ribbon Tables: The Timer / Ribbon Tent will be positioned outside the exit gate and near the finish line. The Timer Person will monitor the runs and timer activation to watch for and react to errors involving improper timer triggers such as bag times or any flying debris such as bugs, or leaves, etc. Ribbons should be available to pick-up by the time you exit the course and walk to the Timer/Ribbon Tent. Please be patient if they are delayed and minimize any communication or talk in the area so they can focus on the job at hand. This job requires focus.

COURSE AND EQUIPMENT

Safety: Safety is of the utmost importance. It is the responsibility of the event committee to ensure the safety of the course, equipment and conduct of those involved with the event. It is recommended that the event committee run a test dog prior to the start of the event to ensure that the equipment functions properly and all personnel understand their jobs. Prior to moving the lure to position it for the start, the lure operator shall announce "hold your dogs" in order to caution owners.

Huntmaster: By AKC rule, The Huntmaster has control of the course. The Huntmaster is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. They shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, the lure is properly positioned, the lure operator, timers and starting line signal person are ready and shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and then give the verbal signal "Tally Ho" for the handler to release the dog.

The Start: The club must provide a 10 foot start box that is clearly marked. The dogs toes must be on or over the back line and not close enough to the start line to set off the timer prematurely. It is recommended an owner or someone familiar with the dog be at the start to release the dog. The Club will attempt to provide assistance at the beginning of the course to release dogs considered to be "safe" as a courtesy, if the owner requests it and if volunteers are available and willing to release a particular dog. Please exit the course as soon as your dog is secured and leashed at the other end.

Field Conditions: The ideal field is reasonably flat, level and mowed. The running area is approximately 150 yards long x 6 yards wide, with a plastic mesh type barrier fencing and flexible support posts. The course is measured to be exactly 100 yards long with finish line timers (electronic or manual) and an appropriate AKC prescribed run-out area. Handlers <u>may not</u> walk the course during or before their dog is released for the actual test.

The Finish: The club must provide enough room for a safe run-out area. The Club will attempt to use a minimum of 50 yards, if onsite conditions at the time of the tests safely allow it. It is recommended an owner or someone familiar with the dog be at the finish to catch the dog once the course is completed. The Club will attempt to provide assistance at the end of the course to collect dogs considered to be "safe" as a courtesy, if the owner requests it and if volunteers are available and willing to collect a particular dog. Please exit the course as soon as your dog is secured and leashed.

Timing Devices: The Club will use electronic timers. The time to complete the course is recorded to the nearest 1/100th of a second. The time starts when any part of the dog crosses the start line. The time stops when any part of the dog crosses the finish line. Stop watches will be used as a backup if the electronic timers don't function. In the event of manual timing, a starter's flag will signal the start when the dog's nose crosses the starting line and the time will be recorded by two timekeepers positioned near the finish line, each operating individually. The time will be the mathematical average of the two manually recorded times.

Lure Equipment: The Club uses a continuous loop system. The lure will consist of white plastic bags and/or squawker. The lure will be propelled by an electric motor attached to a continuous loop setup. Safety is the number one consideration in running this event.

Operation of the Lure: The Lure Operator's job is to 1) ensure a safe run by operating the lure correctly, and 2) to get the best score for your dog. If your dog is new to the sport, tell the Huntmaster so they can notify the LO. That may mean operating the lure differently, to get the dog's attention, as opposed to an experienced dog that needs little to no encouragement. If your dog is particularly fast for it's breed, simply advise the Huntmaster about your dog's typical times or speed. They will tell the LO via radio, who may adjust the running of the lure to accommodate this. Simply saying "fast dog" has no relative meaning as a fast Beagle runs very differently from a fast Whippet. Actual times or speed are much more helpful. The LO has experience and knowledge related to running various breeds, but every dog is different. We want you to have a good run!

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulation appearing in the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog.
